Patricia K. Poprik was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Delaware Valley Regional Finance Authority on January 4, 2017. Prior to serving on the board, Ms. Poprik was the founding President of First American Municipals, Inc., a womanowned investment banking firm specializing in bond underwriting and financial advisory services. At that time, First American was the third womanowned investment banking firm in the nation. In addition, Ms. Poprik was also President of First American Asset Management, a company that specialized in pension fund investments and stock executions.

Ms. Poprik has been actively involved in her community. She has served as a Trustee of Pennsylvania State University, having been appointed by Governor Schweiker in 2002. She was also on the Board of Governors of Warminster Hospital.



She has also been an elected school director of the Council Rock School District and was appointed by Governor Ridge to serve on the Board of Governors of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. For many years, she was on the Eastern Pennsylvania Federal Judicial Nominating Commission and on the Bucks County Community College Foundation Board. She is a former board member and secretary of Pennsylvanians for Effective Government, a pro-business organization, and a former President of the Patrons Foundation, a private philanthropic group.

Currently, she serves as Chairman of the Bucks County Republican Committee and is an Advisory Board member and Lecturer for the Anne Anstine Excellence in Public Service Series. This group's mission is to increase the number of women in government and business through mentoring and training. Ms. Poprik served as Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Republican Party for 17 years.
